Are Beats Solo buds any good?

The Beats Solo Buds offer a tiny case that easily fits in your pocket and long battery life in the buds, but they also come with some pretty big compromises.

How long do Beats Solo earbuds last?

In our battery testing the Beats Solo Buds lasted 17 hours and 24 minutes on a single charge. This is among the best battery life of any wireless earbuds, aided by the lack of ANC. Without a battery inside the charging case, the total battery life is limited to that which the earbuds can hold.

How long does a beats Bud battery last?

For the Beats Solo Buds, it's claimed that they have up to an 18-hour battery life. In testing, this seems to be a fairly accurate claim. The 18 hours seems to be low compared to the 24-hours for the Beats Fit Pro, or the 36 hours of the Beats Studio Buds+.

What's the difference between beats earbuds & solo buds+?

Side by side with an earlier set of Beats wireless earbuds, you can instantly see the big change the Solo Buds usher in: the case is tiny. Beats says it's about 40% smaller than the Solo Buds+ case, and its 2.6 inch long, 1.4 inch tall lozenge slips easily into a pocket or purse.

Do Beats Solo buds have a built-in battery for recharging?

In a world where companies talk a lot about sustainability, the new Beats Solo Buds walk the talk in an unexpected way: the case has no built-in battery for recharging, cutting down on toxic battery landfill waste. But fear not, audio friends!
