

# Total investment cost of rooftop solar battery project in Tunisia

How much is a solar farm worth in Tunisia?

TUNIS, March 24 (Reuters) - Tunisia granted licenses to four international firms to build solar farms with a total capacity of 500 megawatts, together worth 1.2 billion dinars (\$386.31 million), the energy ministry said on Monday.

Which solar projects have been approved in Tunisia?

The Tunisian government has granted licenses to four PV projects with a combined capacity of 500 MW. The selected developers are Qair International, Voltalia, Toyota Tsusho and Scatec. Tunisia's Minister of Industry, Mines and Energy, Fatima Al-Thabat Shabb, has approved four solar projects with a combined capacity of 500 MW.

Is Tunisia a good place to invest in solar energy?

Tunisia's climate presents a key solar energy opportunity and, together with an improved investment framework and a highly skilled workforce, the country should be well positioned to support its ambitious Plan Solaire Tunisien. However, to date, Tunisia has fallen short of its intermediate solar PV targets.

How many new solar power plants are being built in EETC?

Currently, the construction of four additional new solar power plants with a capacity of 200 MW is engaged on site. Kom Ombo PV Solar Project, In October 2019, the EETC signed a solar PPA with a developer for a 200 MW plant at a price of \$0.0275 per kWh that is expected to be completed in Q1 2021.

Which companies are building 100 MW solar plants?

Licenses were awarded to French firm Qair International SAS to build two plants with a total capacity of 300 MW, Voltalia (VLTA.PA) for a 100 MW solar farm, and Norway's Scatec (SCATC.OL) and Japanese firm Aeolus, a unit of Toyota Tsusho (8015.T), for a 100 MW project, the ministry said. Are rooftop photovoltaic panels becoming more popular?

There has been a strong surge in domestic installation of rooftop photovoltaic panels in larger cities. For projects under 1 MW, net metering regulations came into effect in September 2015. The government is targeting at least 1 million customers and adding approximately 3,000 MW of solar power through net metering.
